Regular Doctor Visits

Regular doctor visits for your child are very important. It is recommended to take your children to visit the doctor at the following ages:

2 weeks	2 months	4 months
6 months	9 months	12 months
15 months	18 months	2 years
2 1/2 years	3 years	

Yearly doctor visits after 3 years of age until 18 years of age.

McHenry County Department of Health offers two Well Child clinics each month for children from 2 weeks through 18 years of age

Keep Your Child Healthy

The primary goal of routine preventive Well Child care is to ensure that your child is developing normally. This is especially important during the first 5 years of a child's life due to the rapid growth and developmental milestones that occur.

A comprehensive Well Child exam will include the following components:

- A complete physical exam
- Developmental screening questionnaire for children ages 2 months through 5 1/2 years to help determine how your child is progressing.
- Lead risk assessment on children 6 months through 6 years of age.
- Hemoglobin, glucose, and urinalysis performed if indicated.
- Health history and assessment of any current problems
- Parental Stress Assessment
- Information on how to keep your child healthy.
- Referrals, if a problem is identified during your child's visit.
- Recommended immunizations will be provided as needed (if a complete immunization record is brought to the visit).

What will it cost?

All services are provided on a sliding fee scale and charges are based on your income. Income below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level (see below) is eligible for discount. We accept All Kids/Illinois Public Aid Card.

You will be required to bring two recent paycheck stubs to determine your fee. Failure to provide pay stubs will result in paying for services in full.
