What we did

Prioritized the ELA standards in all areas of literacy (Reading Information, Reading Literature, Writing, Speaking and Listening, Language and Foundational Skills) with literacy coaches (K-5)
Reduced the number of Standards that need to be emphasized to a reasonable amount

Why we did it

To begin a journey towards a more cohesive and unified D15 ELA curriculum

Clarify our areas of instructional emphasis via prioritized standards

Form a consistent baseline level of agreement of standards that should serve as our instructional and curricular foundation

How we did it

Followed the prioritization process as outlined by Larry Ainsworth

Individually identified standards that we viewed as "essential" for each grade level

Arrived at a group consensus and vertically compared chosen prioritized standards to look for gaps and/or redundancies

Rigorous Curriculum Design Steps


- 1. Prioritize the Standards done this summer





