Overview

On March 11, 2021, the American Rescue Plan (ARP) was signed into law. As part of the law, the United States Department of Education will provide **\$121.9 billion** for the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER III Fund).

McHenry School District 15 has been allocated \$4,497,236 in ARP-ESSER III funds. There is a **federal set aside** (20%) of the total allocation that must be designated to address learning loss. Additionally, there are **three state reservations** that will be included through the allotment of funds.

A requirement of receipt of these funds is the development of a **Return to Learn Continuity Plan** and a **ARP-ESSER III Funds Plan**. This document provides information and details of both plans.

Stakeholders will have the opportunity to provide input on the Use of ARP-ESSER III Funds Plan for 30 days following this presentation to the McHenry District 15 School Board of Education.

Projected Personnel Allocation: \$500,000



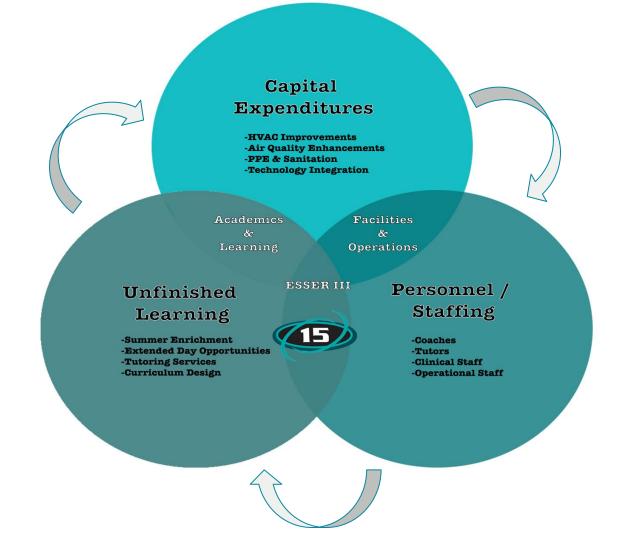

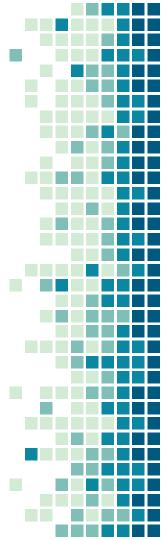
