
Fixed vs. Growth in a Nutshell

Effort	I had to work hard; how embarrassing.	I worked hard; I'm proud of it.
Failure	It is not my fault.	What can I learn from this?

"You're a natural leader/writer/artist"




IS Frequent, open, honest IS Improvement oriented

- What can I/you share?




SOLICITING, RECEIVING, & GIVING FEEDBACK WELL ARE SKILLS THAT ARE LEARNED & DEVELOPED!

A teacher wants to praise students for effective effort, but more than half his/her class is sailing through the required work and curriculum. He/she doesn't know what to do.



A student does not believe they can complete the task assigned and/or meet the target.



A parent contacts you because her child explained that the reason he is struggling in writer's workshop is because you told the class that you wanted them to choose a challenging topic to grapple with.



The parent thinks that the teacher has an unrealistically high expectation for students at this level of class.
