Ecuador is slightly smaller than the Philippines or the state of Nevada. It is the smallest country on the western coast of South America. Despite its size, Ecuador has a wide range of landscapes, including volcanoes, rain forests, coastlines, and the Andes Mountains, which run down the center of the country. Such differences in landscape bring a variety of natural hazards. Ecuador often suffers earthquakes, floods, volcanic activity, landslides, and droughts (dry periods).

Ecuador is divided into four different regions: the Costa (coastal lowland), the Sierra (Andes Mountains), the Oriente (eastern lowland), and the Galápagos Islands in the Pacific. The Costa is a large flat plain that includes beaches, mangrove forests, and marshes. Shrimp farms are common in this region and many tropical fruits are grown here, including bananas, passion fruit, melon, and mango. The Sierra is a section of high volcanoes and valleys between two chains of the Andes. Condors, hummingbirds, and

llamas are found in this area. The Oriente region, which contains part of the Amazon rain forest, covers more than half of Ecuador. Jaguars, sloths, and monkeys live in the forests of the Oriente. Two major rivers, the Napo and the Pastaza, flow through this region. The Galapagos Islands were formed millions of years ago by the eruption of volcanoes. More than 20,000 people now live on the islands, and so do thousands of different plant and animal species. Some of these aren't found anywhere else in the world. The majority of this region is now a national park.

Ecuador has two seasons; wet and dry. The rainy, warm season lasts from January to May, while June through December is dryer and cooler. In the Sierra, the rainy season is cooler and the dry season is warmer. Ecuador lies in the center of the El Niño weather pattern, which is based on a warm ocean current bringing warm winds that often cause floods and mudslides along Ecuador's coastlines. El Niño means "the child," a name it got because it usually hits around Christmastime, when Ecuadorians and neighboring Catholic nations celebrate the birth of the baby Jesus. The average temperature in the capital of Quito is 71°F (22°C).
